Brothers and Sisters it brings me great pleasure to bring you the news that Local 192 has received the word from the UA that we can hold elections in December 2015. All of us in the office and JATC have worked hard to accomplish what needed to be done to get to this point. Tony, Rick and I drove out to the University of Wyoming and saw that they have started to break ground. We are still working to get Rasmussen to sign with us. They are a Mechanical Service Contractor out of Rapid City, SD.
